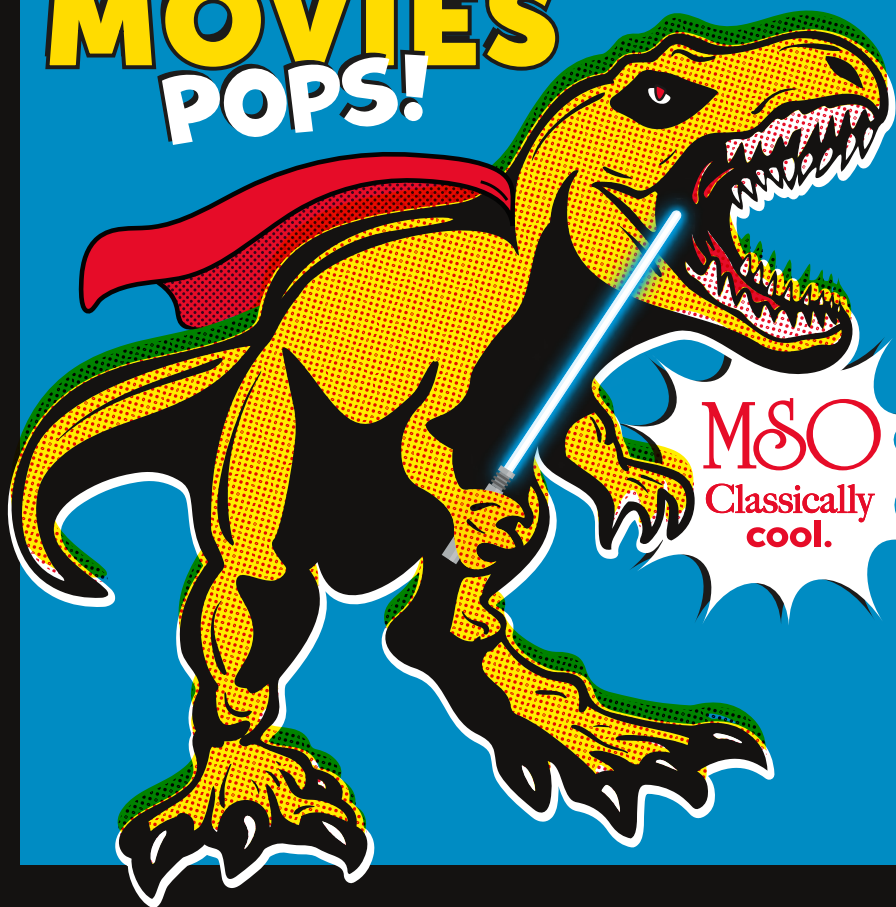

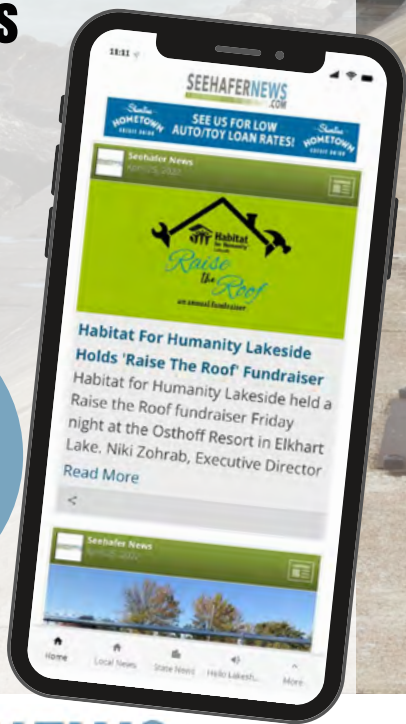

### *Tickets and getting here*

**THE BEST DEAL.** Buy season tickets and save. Otherwise, tickets start at \$28 a pop and \$10 for folk under 35 plus fees. Yes, really, \$10 for those who are under 35 years of age! Music is for all.

**THE BEST SEAT.** They're all good. It's a pretty intimate hall so there really is no bad seat in the house. That said, our diehards argue the center—downstairs or upstairs—offers the best acoustic.

**ARRIVE EARLY.** Once the music starts the CCC Police (the ushers) won't allow you into the hall until a break. Most concerts start with a shorter piece, often an overture, which is ten minutes or so. If you're late, after this first piece is your window for slipping in.

**PARKING.** I hope you didn't park on Franklin... just kidding. Anywhere's fine.

**ACCESSIBILITY.** The CCC has accessible seating for all on the first level. There is wheelchair access through the front door, the restrooms are ADA accessible, and the CCC does have a few wheelchairs available on site.

### *While you're in your seat*

Food and drink. Yes, drinks can be brought into the auditorium. There are even cup holders in the seats on the main floor! Please imbibe responsibly and with live music. And if you haven't been to the CCC recently, there's now a bar on the second level—it's easier than ever to relax at intermission and not have to worry about getting in line at the

bar. Sorry, the CCC does not permit food in the auditorium. I so wish we could have popcorn.

**PHONES.** Yes, phones are allowed, just silence them. We want you to be you. Should you wish to check in on social media and share your experience, great. Take that selfie while the orchestra warms up or with friends at intermission. Take that video of the audience jumping to their feet after the show is over. We only ask that phones are silenced and dimmed so that they're not distracting those on stage or those sitting nearby. In other words, please be respectful to those around you. We hope that your phone blows up, really we do, we just ask that you keep it to yourself that you're so popular. And, no flash photography or video recording please—you don't want YouTube to suspend your account because you owe someone \$.008 in royalties.

**ETIQUETTE.** Scoff. If you like something, don't sit on your hands! Clap, heck, hoot and holler if you hear something that delights. In olden days the "classical" music audience was downright rowdy. Etiquette now dictates that one is supposed to repress their applause until the very end of a multi-movement work. Double-scoff. Our policy is that if the music makes you have an emotional reaction, feel free to express it, whenever this may be. We embolden you to be you and share what you're feeling. Probably, others will want to join in with you. (continued)

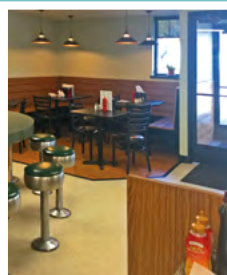

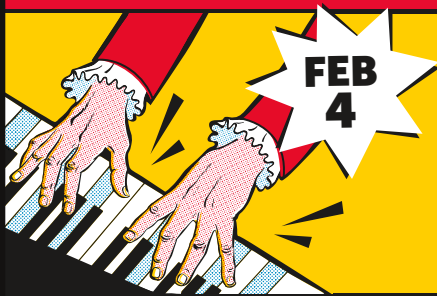

Damon is a native of Ladd, Illinois, which is about 100 miles southwest of Chicago. He graduated from Hall High School in Spring Valley, Illinois, in 1969, received an Associate degree from Illinois Valley Community College and later completed a Radio/TV course at the Institute of Broadcast Arts in Chicago.

He began his radio career in 1973 at WGSY-FM in La Salle-Peru, Illinois, before moving to Neenah, Wisconsin one year later to work at WNAM-AM. He was employed there in the News and Sports Departments until the summer of 1977.

After a several-month stay at WMKC-FM in Oshkosh, Damon accepted a position at WOMT-AM in early November of 1977, and he has been employed in the lakeshore area ever since. Damon has been married to his wife, Mary, since August of 1987, and together they have a daughter, Emily. Damon has served in this community as an alderman for one term, covered the last term of the late mayor Anthony Dufek and the beginning of Kevin Crawford's first term in office.

Damon has also been involved in the United Way as a campaign co-chairman and board member, is enshrined in the Lakeshore All-Sports Hall of Fame, honored on the Lincoln High School Athletics Wall of Fame, is part of the LASHOF

Committee, and has served as an emcee of the Annual Hall of Fame Enshrinement Banquet for many years. Damon has also been part of the Manitowoc Family Aquatic Center Board, American Legion Baseball Board of Directors, and St. Francis of Assisi Men's Choir, among other pursuits. Damon enjoys traveling with his family, walking, golfing, fishing, and, of course, covering all sorts of sports!

He recently received the "Friend" Award from the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association at their Hall of Fame Banquet in September of 2021. ■

John Williams is a living legend. There's not enough room in this program to list all of his awards and accomplishments. But, I will share his most impressive stat: He's second only to Walt Disney with 52 Oscar nominations. Second. Only. To. Disney. Is he the greatest living musician? Maybe. Is he the greatest American musician? Maybe. Ever? Who you gonna put in front of him? Duke Ellington, George Gershwin, Leonard Bernstein? If awards mean anything, Williams has 72 Grammy nominations. (Jay-Z is tops with 83).

What makes his music so... legendary? Melody, orchestration, and something called leitmotif. The melody bit is obvious. We've all hummed the Jaws tuba theme (duh dum) in a pool. We've all creepily snuck around on tiptoes with wand in hand while whistling the Harry Potter theme. (Just me?) We've all destroyed sandcastles, gnarling our teeth and showing our claws, to the thundering tune of Jurassic Park. (Just me again?) The best composers know melody. Mozart, Tchaikovsky, Bob Dylan. And the best melodies, they transcend their medium.

The orchestration bit is also obvious. "Over 99 Billion Served," proves my point. Give me all the salt and all the sugar. This is what Williams does; everyone plays. He's very generous, writing many dense layers. Think

Dr. Pepper's 23 ingredients or mole's (the sauce from Mexico) 30 ingredients. I kid, but there is something special about complexity. For example, Williams used ~110 orchestral ingredients in his Star Wars soundtracks, not including singers, to create luxurious "Super Sized" sounds. Most impressive, maybe, is that Williams' rich orchestrations are not the main feature, they're the background, the complement to the main dish. Magically, Chef Williams composes soaring melodies over a crowded harmonic grove that, well, just feels good to play and even better to hear. (And never are his orchestrations cliché. A trick he's taught us is to use percussion to accentuate, rarely to offer the groove.)

What about that leitmotif bit? A leitmotif is a recurring theme associated with a specific character, idea, or situation. Think the sinister

melody we hear whenever we see Darth Vader. Think “The Force Theme” that we hear when Luke looks out over the twin suns of Tatooine (or the 100 other times we hear it in the franchise). Think the “Dual of the Fates Theme” that is heard throughout the three Star Wars prequels, suggesting inner conflict, and later literal conflict. From where did Williams’ leitmotif inspiration come? Erich Korngold (1897-1957), one of the originators of film music, who composed almost exclusively with leitmotif as he attempted to give “musical identities” to characters and sequences of a film. Korngold hoped his music, by use of leitmotif, would make the story, and its development, more clear to the viewer. His film scores were operatic, but without the singing. Did someone say opera? Because Korngold was inspired to use leitmotif by someone too.

Enter the infamous Richard Wagner (1813-1883), who invented the technique and whose use of Leitmotiv (gotta use the German when talking about Wagner) in his epic opera cycle *The Ring of the Nibelung* (17 hours long!) outnumbers the use of even Williams’ nine Star Wars films (20 hours long!). Other musical influences are readily apparent to the Classical Heads amongst us: Tchaikovsky, Strauss, Holst, Elgar, Orff. When hearing the music from these masters, some call Williams a thief, but as the adage goes, Lesser artists borrow. Great artists steal.

### Fun facts

- Williams’ father (Johnny) was a jazz drummer who had a career performing on Hollywood soundstages but was a trained architect.
- Williams first developed his chops by arranging music as a member of the U.S. Air Force Band.
- Williams was a piano student at Juilliard in the mid 50s whose classmates were Van Cliburn (1934-2013) and John Browning (1933-2003). Though he moved toward composition he still tickled the keys from time to time. Famously, you can hear Williams play piano on the 1960 film *West Side Story*.
- Before his first blockbuster success of *Jaws* in 1975, Williams wrote music for *Gilligan’s Island* (the pilot episode!) and *Lost in Space* (1965-1968).
- Williams was inducted into the Olympic Order. You know who else is in the Order? Nelson Mandela and two Popes. Mic drop.
- One of Williams’ sons is a singer with TOTO.
- Williams actually makes an appearance in a Star Wars film (Episode IX) as a bartender. ■

Dylan Thomas Chmura-Moore, D.M.A., is in his third year as Music Director of Manitowoc Symphony Orchestra. He is honored to be just the fourth director of the symphony and call Manitowoc a new home. In addition, Dylan is Associate Professor of Music at UW-Oshkosh, where he is director of orchestras. He frequently conducts the Oshkosh Symphony Orchestra, was director of the Ripon College Symphony Orchestra, and previously taught at Holy Family College. In addition, Dylan has conducted ensembles of Harvard University, New England Conservatory, Longy School of Music, Northeastern University, Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory of Music, and other groups such as Callithumpian Consort and Shivaree Ensemble. Some of the conductors with whom Dylan has had the opportunity to intimately observe and work are Pierre Boulez, Robert Page, Larry Rachleff, Gunther Schuller, Joseph Silverstein, and Benjamin Zander.

Dylan is an active solo, chamber, and orchestral musician, and has recently performed with Madison Symphony Orchestra and Wisconsin Chamber Orchestra. Notable international appearances include performances at the Internationale Ferienkurse Fur Neue Musik in Darmstadt, Germany, and the Lucerne Festival in Lucerne, Switzerland. Dylan can be heard on Mode, Summit, EuroArts, Albany, TZADIK, and the Accentus record labels. His solo album, Flag, was released by Peer 2 Records.

Dylan was awarded the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from UW-Madison. He was a Paul Collins Wisconsin Distinguished Graduate Fellow and focused his studies on the research and performance of newly composed music. Previously, Dylan studied at New England Conservatory in Boston, Massachusetts, where he received two Master of Music degrees. Upon graduation, Dylan was awarded academic honors, a distinction in performance, and the Gunther Schuller Medal—the highest honor awarded by the conservatory. For 30 years, the MSO has been fortunate to have members of the community open their homes for the Symphony fundraising event "Holiday Tour of Homes." During this unique event, attendees have the opportunity to enjoy homes beautifully decorated by professional florists and decorators while helping the Symphony provide classical music to the Lakeshore.

During the pandemic, our event—like many other events—was cancelled. The MSO Board of Directors optimistically considered reviving the tradition this year, however, after much deliberation, the decision has been made to cancel the Holiday Tour of Homes for 2022.

This difficult choice was made based on three major concerns: homeowners and volunteers alike have valid concerns regarding COVID-19 and crowds; similar events are seeing low participation; and the cost of hosting the event is quite high while the return on investment is low. The driving factor for holding the event is fundraising for the MSO and its mission of providing classical music to the Lakeshore.

The MSO is not giving up on holding the Holiday Tour of Homes in 2023! We are exploring ideas to make it different and more profitable. A Friday evening pre-tour? A cocktail party? If you have ideas to share, they are most welcome!

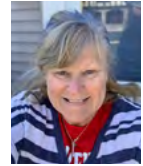

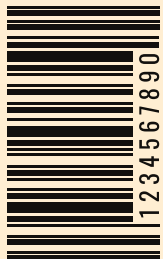

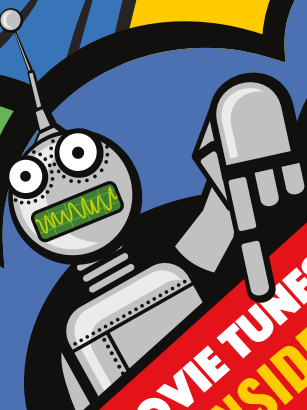
